

A very helpful man just booked me a couple of COVID vaccines. When he found out what I do, he even wished me a very blessed day! How cool is that. The crowds that followed Jesus saw him as a vaccine as well. All manner of things could be healed just by touching his cloak. So desperate were they for healing that every one pressed in on every side, such that he didn't even get time for sleep or food.



Christians are hard wired for compassion. Following the example of Jesus and even our own Nurse Maude; we love to care. What stands out for me in today's Gospel is the compassion Jesus has for the disciples. "Come and rest a while with me," he urges them.

St Augustine 1500 years ago realised that in order to be more like Jesus he needed to enlarge his heart. He prayed, "The house of my soul is too narrow for you to come in; let it be enlarged by you. It is in ruins. Please restore my soul."

We need to open ourselves more to compassion, but this doesn't mean we don't take the time we need to restore ourselves. It also doesn't mean that we give in to the tyranny of niceness that never makes a stand, or never confronts or never makes change for fear of offending. Rather like Jesus we lean into God and seek God's will, that the house of our soul might be enlarged by love.


