### God's eye view

There are all sorts of blindness. There's physical blindness: Bartimaeus has this in our Gospel. But there is also blindness to who Jesus really is. The crowd has this kind of blindness. But there is another type of blindness: blindness to the importance of community. COVID has opened our eyes to our need of human community. Ironically



Bartimaeus, although blind, can see Jesus for who he is and can see his own need for human company. Jesus cures his sight, and restores him to community, which is symbolised by the laying down of his begging cloak.

Only some of us are physically blind, but we all need each other. This is one of the great gifts of church. Whether we gather for worship or a working bee; to drop our kids off at preschool, or for coffee and a chat, we can find at church companions on our journey.

Let's never be blind to our need of each other.

 All places of worship must have ways for attendees to record their visit. This can be done by asking everyone to scan in using the NZ COVID Tracer app, or by recording their contact details manually.

Offer online services so people who cannot attend in person can

participate.

• Some religious rituals or practices need close contact — for example, a christening. Try to keep the time spent in close contact to a minimum.

Remove communal resources such

as prayer mats or prayer books.

Encourage attendees to wear a

face covering.

 Clean and sanitise musical instruments and other shared surfaces thoroughly before and after use.

 Singing, for example church choirs and other types of performance can go ahead. Performers do not need to

wear a face covering.

 You can serve food and drink and host events or functions such as catered morning tea — as long as you keep to the gathering limits.
 Encourage contactless donations instead of a cash collection box.

This week our older children have been playing scientist. We have been undertaking science experiments using ingredients found in the kitchen (called kitchen chemistry). We started with an experiment adding ingredients to milk. We have used a lot of baking soda and vinegar as we explored chemical reactions that occur when they are mixed together in different quantities.
