

The unsung hero of the first Christmas is St Joseph. There are lots of carols about St Mary, the Angels, the shepherds, even the donkey (who isn't in the Bible!) There are carols about Snoopy, the little drummer boy, the Holly and the Ivy, about the tree the Holy Family stood under, even the place; Bethlehem, but Joseph gets no mention.



You may know of a carol about poor old Joe, but I guarantee it's not well known. Anglicans are funny about Joseph, we don't sing about him, we don't have stained glass windows about him, we don't name our churches after him, and yet he is key to the whole Christmas event. Without his willingness to stand by Mary, we may never have heard of Jesus. Joseph is open to the guidance of God through dreams and no doubt much of the character of Jesus, that we see in the Gospels, he would have gained from Joseph.

Men in particular have so much to learn from Joe: how we are to be faithful to the women in our lives, standing by them in hard times when others turn away; how men have such an important role in shaping and forming children to be wonderful people; how men too are to be guided and directed by the Holy Spirit.

Under Traffic Light System

This message came from the Anglican Bishops, Tikanga Pākehā on Friday, 26 November 2021: "Out of a deep love for the church and the people we serve, we have sought to approach the next stage of our nation's response to this world-wide health emergency a way that reflects two key eements in common: 1. The agreements normative position for worship, events and gatherings, is that they will be fully -vaccinated. 2. We have a pastoral responsibility for the care of all people. This responsibility is to both vaccinated and non-vaccinated, but particularly to the most vulnerable." What this means for us is that there are no limits on the number at worship but proof of double vaccine will be requested to attend worship and church events. If this is difficult for you, please talk to the clergy. If you are having trouble downloading your "My Vaccine Pass" again please let us know so that we căn help.
