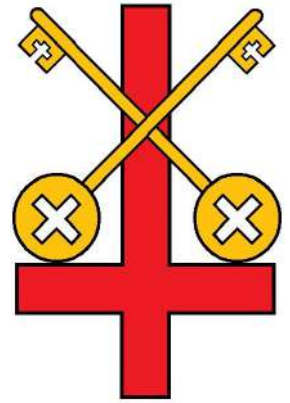

New ways

This weekend we celebrate the patronal festival of St Luke's Yaldhurst. St Luke's has been worshipped in across 3 centuries and always been part of St Peter's. We know St Luke as the author of both the Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts in the Bible. It is easy to take his writings for granted, after all we have been reading and studying his Gospel for almost 2000 years. But a Gospel was a new form of writing. Nobody had ever tried it before. And Luke brings his special concern for the poor, for the foreigner, for the sick and for women. Without his Gospel we wouldn't have the Prodigal son, the healed lepers, or the good Samaritan.



In our day we are being called to be radical as Luke was and find new ways of sharing God's love. One such way has been live-streaming the worship. Before Covid, few of us had any notion of doing this, but now we do it every week. Just as the new genre of a Gospel has reached millions we need to ask God for new ways of sharing God's love. With lots of courage and imagination like Luke we can look forward to many more patronal festivals at St Luke's.
