



# **Bachelor of Counselling (Level 7)**

#### Programme Overview

The Bachelor of Counselling is designed to train students to become ethical, professional counsellors who are skilled and knowledgeable in counselling practice.

During this first intensive year of study, students develop a strong understanding of counselling theory, including counselling process, self-awareness, human development, personal and professional boundaries, and principles of psychology.

On-campus classes enhance the theoretical depth of students' knowledge and awareness, underpinning the practical counselling experience. Throughout years two and three of study, students will complete 200 hours of face-to-face counselling practice.

A Person-Centred approach is developed within a Christian faith-based learning environment. Openness toward diversity in culture, spirituality and worldview is highly valued, as is the importance of developing a mission or purpose in one's life.

As Vision College offers the Bachelor of Counselling from a Christian faith-based perspective, it is intended to develop graduates who can enter the counselling field with the competence to work through body, mind and spiritual wellness, valuing the uniqueness of each individual in achieving holistic wellbeing or Te Whare Tapa Whā.
