I was going to do the talk when I was reading the notice board of children's allergies at Cathedral grammar school. The most common allergy and for some the most deadly was allergy to nuts. I wanted the talk to be memorable just not that memorable!



The point of the talk and Jesus point in the Gospel is the huge difference salt makes, and light makes and he hopes us Christians. We are to be salt and light in the community.

This lines up with my experience. For the smallness of their number its amazing the difference Christians make to our community. Schools, hospitals, service clubs, sports clubs, and even our social welfare system have all been started and maintained by Christians. We don't have a monopoly on good works but we do punch above our weight.

Salt and light. Small things, yet they make a big difference. May that always be true of us too.


Cliff and Marjorie were married in 1950 and bought the farm. Jenny, Sue and John were born from this farm and have regularly attended St Luke's as a family throughout the


