original recommendations following consultation.

What this motion means: The Parish will:

Ensure PRAYER is a priority in the parish; develop a DISCIPLE MAKÍNG process or 'spiritual pathway' so that all parishioners can continue to grow as set up an Adult Education disciples; Committee including setting up a DISCUSSION GROUP to assist parishioners in advocacy and action on matters of social justice and care of creation" develop a greater emphasis on the MINISTRY OF ALL THE BAPTISED by building our lay leadership capacity; undertake a STEWARDSHIP PROGRAMME in the next six months so that new people are encouraged to become regular financial givers, existing parishioners prayerfully re-evaluate their giving, and everyone can respond to the vision and growth priorities of the parish; set up a COMMUNICATIONS TEAM to develop a comprehensive communication strategy (including website, email, social media, print media and signage) to lift our profile in the community, and enable enquirers to find and visit our parish; develop an STRATEGY **INCORPORATION** help to newcomers feel they belong and become fully parish; of involved in the life the continue to consider ways of making the PARISH OFFICE more accessible to parishioners and newcomers as the 'heart' of the parish; move the 9.30am service to 9.15am to enable a new congregation to be planted at 10.45am which would have a contemporary, Anglican feel with band music and a Children's Ministry; continue to take steps regarding our responsibility to care for creation; finance committee; establish and, а establish a building committee.




