

Designing a new altar frontal for St John's Timaru we began to brainstorm symbols which might go on it. A chalice was an obvious one. Some wheat another. A cross almost too obvious, and a crown of thorns. A towel and a bowl for washing feet another good idea. Then someone suggested a whip of cords. After all that was what Jesus used to cleanse the temple of the



money changers. In all honesty the embroider said, "I'm sorry I don't think my bible has that story."

For many Christians their bibles or at least their understanding of Jesus doesn't include him having enough passion to drive out money changers. We sometimes have a sort of 1 dimensional Sunday school sort of Jesus, meek and very much mild.

As a result we think anger, passion and zeal are somehow wrong. Back in the 1970's, Gordon McLauclan wrote a book called the Passionless People. Recently updated he describes kiwis as passionless, a society of zombies unmoved by; child poverty, domestic violence or low wages.

Rather Jesus offers us our full humanity. It is not our anger or passion which is the problem. Rather its how we use it that matters.

As you know, I offered to market items on Trade Me for parishioners provided the parish could get a commission from proceeds. We also sell on Trade Me and at McCormack and McKellar (Art auctioneers) items that we retrieve from those donated to our garage sale, if we think we might get significantly more from these methods of sale. At the last garage sale, Dianne Rait's grandson Liam, who is a trader, drew our attention to three paintings which he thought were worth more than we could get at the garage sale, and another trader also pointed out a ceramic ornament (that I thought looked pretty ugly), as a desirable item. I took all four items to McCormack and McKellar, who agree to put two of the paintings and the ornament in the next appropriate auction. The result was that the ornament sold for \$70 - we netted \$54 after commission - and the two paintings sold for \$1000.00 - us netting \$770. Are there any





Dear Friends and Supporters of St Andrew's High School,

We have just arrived home from our final visit to the school in Tonga, after an unforgettable week during which we handed over the reins of the Hornsby Trust to Jonathan and Salote Austin. They were with us over the long weekend for a number of gatherings, culminating in a most moving farewell and dinner put on for us by the school. This included tables groaning with food, singing, dancing (see photo), speeches, tears and presentations. A photo shows one of the "Hornsby Scholarship school students" - a lovely girl in Form 4, speaking on behalf of the students who had had their fees paid by your donations. (Note the whole lobster in the foreground, and a roasted piglet at the far end of the table).

There is no doubt that paying student fees has been a really worth while way of supporting the school, as well as helping the students and their families.





It was very interesting to hear Jonathan mention a few times in speeches that he grew up in a family without much money, and that his school fees were paid by none other than the Hornsbys, who were family friends - so that goes a long way to explain why he and Salote are so passionate about continuing this work.

Another highlight of our visit was a night out with the tertiary students, and again a photo is attached. Your donations are

supporting eight of them this year, at the University of the South Pacific, Tupou Tertiary Institute, Teachers' College and Nursing School. Two of them were unable to come to the dinner, but we caught up with them separately. Front left of the photo is Latai, who has now graduated from Teachers' College and has her first job teaching at "Ocean of Light", a Baha'i school here in Tonga which is reputed to be the best, as all the diplomats send their children there - so she has done well.

It has been fascinating to discover that at least three students we've been supporting to become music teachers in recent years came under the influence of Kaveinga Vaka while they were students at St Andrew's, and attribute their career choice to his example. (Kaveinga has just had his scholarship extended by the Diocese for two more years, so that he can do his Masters degree at Auckland).

Our visit to the school coincided with a visit from the new Archbishop of Polynesia, Sione Uluilakepa, who was Principal of St Andrew's when we first began visiting the school in 2010. The school is of course very close to his heart, and it is hoped he will support some new initiatives there.

We feel that the time is right for us to bring this chapter of our lives to a close, and it is so good knowing that the Trust is in such good hands for the future. Thank you for your friendship and support over so many years.
